Project Director's Report

Five projects were undertaken in 2021.

- 1. Web Redesign for our website. Partly funded by Canada Council for the Arts and from general revenues of MCSD-DAM. We hired Amphibian Design to do the work. We wanted more capabilities and functionality for our website that would download videos quickly and easily as well as being easy to navigate. The website went online December 2021.
- 2. Magic of ASL + LSQ: The Covid-19 Edition Funded by Canada Council for the Arts. We received \$19,864 and almost broke even. It took much hard work to pivot to the on-line format. Fourteen Deaf performing acts from across Canada were pivoted to an on-line format and the show premiered across Canada on June 6, 2021. It was a huge success and the video can be accessed through the website and on YouTube!
- 3. A New Rhythm: Teaching Beyond Sound filming project funded by Canadian Council for the Arts and Manitoba Arts Council. The dance instructional films were in post-production and captioned in both English and French. The English Interview Panel needs a change then will be sent out to be French Captioned. All the other films are now online on the website free to view. Non-deaf dance teachers are the main target audience. Four downloadable documents with tips and other suggestions for interacting with the Deaf dancers are available in English and French.
- 4. Building Big Bridges with a Little ASL/LSQ funded by Winnipeg Arts Council: is in progress. These films have dance terms in ASL/LSQ to assist non-Deaf dance teachers with communicating with their Deaf students. The films are in post-production and the ASL film will go on-line by mid-April. Once the ASL version is finished, the LSQ version will follow the same format and will be completed later in the year.
- 5. Restart program funded by Winnipeg Arts Council. The board met for a day at a retreat at *The Inn at the Forks* to revamp MCSD-DAM Mission, Vision, Goals statements and create Values for the organization. Covid-19 Manitoba Government health protocols were followed.

- Worked with MAWA (Mentoring Artist for Women's Arts) and AANM to create a mentorship program for Deaf, Hard-of-hearing and hearing artists to be led by Bram Keast an artist who is Hard-of-Hearing.

Bylaws change proposal

Bylaws 2017

Changes:

Bylaws - 8.10 section:

8.10 Remuneration of Board Members

No Board member shall receive remuneration from MCSD other than for out-of pocket expenses.

Proposal -

8.10 Remuneration of Board Members

No Board member shall receive remuneration from MCSD other than for out-of-pocket expenses and/or;

The MCSD Board can be hired on a contract basis for duties outside of or beyond the norm, under the conditions that:

- a) Specific circumstances make them the best candidate for the position
- b) Decisions made regarding this employment are made in their absence
- c) The annual value of the contract position(s) does not exceed \$5,000.00.
- d) Decisions regarding contract employment of Board Members are made with the Board's knowledge and approval.

Reasons -

Rationale to change the by-laws is that we have trouble finding Deaf people to hire for projects because of the lack of experience outside the MCSD-DAM board. Our Deaf community is so small and the board is often composed of people that can do the work and they should be compensated for taking on extra work beyond their duties as board members.
